<a href="#">CollegeData</a>		Has a “scholarship finder” where you can plug in different criteria (GPA, residency, area of study, etc.) and search for scholarships you would be eligible for
<a href="#">1800wheelchair.com Scholarship</a>	\$500.00	There are no requirements in terms of physical disability or ability. All applications are welcome. Must be 16 years or older with a minimum GPA of 3.0. "In the past, we've asked applicants to explore mobility issues on campus, overcoming personal challenges, and much more."
<a href="#">AAHD Frederick J. Krause Scholarship on Health and Disability</a>	Under \$1,000.00	Applicants for this scholarship have completed at least 1 year in college with a diagnosed disability who are <b>pursuing a degree related to health and disability including public health, health promotion, disability studies, disability research, rehabilitation engineering and audiology.</b>
<a href="#">Anderson Minority Specific Scholarship</a>	\$250.00	Includes African American, Asian, Jewish, Pakistani, Hispanic, LGBTQ, Native American, etc. Must be a college student living with a physical ailment, physical disease, and/or physical disability. Must be enrolled as full/part time student, and must not be on academic probation.
<a href="#">Business Plan Scholarship For Students With Disabilities</a>	\$2,500.00	This scholarship requires applicants to write an essay about “What I learned from writing a business plan.” Essays are judged by the co-founders of Fit Small Business on originality, writing style and quality of ideas.
<a href="#">CURE Education Enrichment Fund Scholarship</a>	Up to \$5,000	A one-time scholarship (up to \$5,000 ) for those living with epilepsy, family members & caregivers. The scholarship is to be used toward coursework to advance personal knowledge in research, health education, advocacy and/or awareness in relation to their experiences with epilepsy.
<a href="#">EWI Scholarship</a>	Up to \$10,000	EWI is proud to support the educational funding of students that reside within our chapter boundaries. Both the EWISP (EWI Scholarship Program) and the ASIST (Adult Students in Scholastic Transition) programs are administered locally in our chapter cities. Please note that our programs require the student applying to reside within our chapter boundaries as a primary qualification.
<a href="#">FACES</a>	\$500-\$5,000	Annually provides partial financial support for the education of <b>NYU incoming freshmen or currently enrolled college students</b> affected by epilepsy and seizure disorders; award amount will vary from a minimum of \$500 and will not exceed \$5,000 per student, depending on the applicant’s financial need. The program is seeking to recognize the personal accomplishments of those living with epilepsy during their college journey
<a href="#">Google Lime Scholarship</a>	\$10,000.00	Google is committed to helping the innovators of the future make the most of their talents by providing scholarships and networking retreats for <b>computer science (or similar field) students with disabilities.</b> Candidates will also be considered for software engineering internship opportunities with Google.

True to form, The GVTC Foundation is awarding a total of up to \$50,000 in scholarships to well-deserving high school seniors from households that subscribe to at least one GVTC service in pursuit of their higher education.</i>
<a href="#">Joey Stowell Scholarship</a>	\$500.00	Must be a college student living with a physical ailment, physical disease, and/or physical disability. Must be enrolled as full/part time student, and must not be on academic probation.
<a href="#">Lorraine Nelson Herrick Scholarship in Arts and Sciences</a>	Varies	<b>University of Colorado at Boulder:</b> (1) undergraduate or graduate enrolled in the College of Arts and Sciences, (2) have a demonstrated disability, and (3) demonstrated academic merit. <b>Special consideration is given to, but not limited to, Colorado residents, students with multiple sclerosis, and/or declared anthropology majors.</b>
<a href="#">Microsoft disAbility Scholarship</a>	\$5,000-\$20,000 per year	Awarded to promising high school students with financial need who plan to attend a vocational or academic college. This nonrenewable scholarship is <b>designed for students declaring a major in engineering, computer science, computer information systems, law, business or a related field (e.g. paralegal, pre-law, finance, business administration, or marketing).</b>
<a href="#">NBCUniversal Tony Coelho Media Scholarship</a>	\$5,625	The NBCUniversal Tony Coelho Media Scholarship will offer eight (8) scholarships to <b>undergraduate and graduate students with disabilities who are interested in pursuing a career in the communications, media, or entertainment industry</b>
<a href="#">Newcombe Scholarships (multiple scholarships)</a>	Varies	Support for students with disabilities. Please see website for list of scholarships. <b>Opportunities available for undergraduate, doctoral, mature, and economically disadvantaged students.</b> Some scholarships limited to select institutions.
<a href="#">Patient Advocate Foundation Scholarship for Survivors</a>	\$3,000 annually for up to 4 years	... Honor individuals who have suffered or are suffering a life-threatening disease or chronic condition that are pursuing a higher education. <b>Requirement: Been diagnosed with or been actively treated (surgery or hospitalization) for a chronic, life-threatening, or life-debilitating disease within the past 5 years</b>
<a href="#">Pfizer Epilepsy Scholarship</a>	\$3,000	Students at the <b>high school (seniors) and college (freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior who has applied to graduate ) levels</b> are eligible to apply. Applicants must be under a doctor's care for epilepsy, have done well in school, and must show that they have participated in community and extracurricular activities. Interested individuals are required to submit an official school transcript and two letters of recommendation with their application form.
<a href="#">Ryan Siddique Scholarship</a>	Up to 5000	Provides financial scholarships and support services to students diagnosed with epilepsy

<a href="#">Student Award Program of FSD</a>	\$1,000.00	<p>... Helps to increase opportunities in science, engineering, mathematics, technology, and pre-medical/dental areas for <b>graduate or professional students</b> with disabilities. FSD has established a Science Graduate Student Grant Fund, which is available to fourth year undergraduates (who are disabled and have been accepted to a graduate or professional school in the sciences) and graduate science students who have a disability. <b>Awards of \$1000 each are made to support research projects of qualified university students in any field of Mathematics, Science, Medicine, Technology, or Engineering.</b></p>
<a href="#">Tommy Tranchin Award</a>	Up to \$1,200	<p>Established to support students with physical, emotional, or intellectual disabilities who have shown promise or passion in an activity that will promote their personal development in their particular field of interest. <b>Please note that the Tommy Tranchin Award is not intended to offset costs associated with obtaining a college or university degree.</b></p>
<a href="#">Tony and Jan Viessman Memorial Scholarship</a>	\$1,000	<p>This scholarship is offered through the national offices of the <b>Epilepsy Foundation</b> and applicants must create an account to apply. The program awards four \$1000 scholarships per year to outstanding students who <b>serve as positive role models for people with epilepsy</b>. To be eligible, students must be enrolled in, or awaiting acceptance from, an accredited US college or university.</p>
<a href="#">UCB Family Epilepsy Scholarship Program</a>	\$5,000-\$10,000	<p>UCB will award thirty-two scholarships to people living with epilepsy, their family members and caregivers pursuing higher education. The recipients of the Epilepsy Leader Scholarships <b>will demonstrate academic and personal achievement and will also exemplify some of the qualities that Drs. Helmers and Pellock were best known for including a desire to advocate for and serve others, an interest in positively contributing to the epilepsy community and a persevering spirit.</b></p>
<a href="#">Wells Fargo Scholarship Program for People with Disabilities</a>	\$2,500	<p>To apply, you must have an identified disability (defined as someone who has, or considers themselves to have, a long-term or recurring issue that impacts one or more major life activity), be a <b>high school senior or graduate planning to enroll, or who are already enrolled, in full- or half-time undergraduate study</b> at an accredited two- or four-year college or university in the United States, and have a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.</p>
